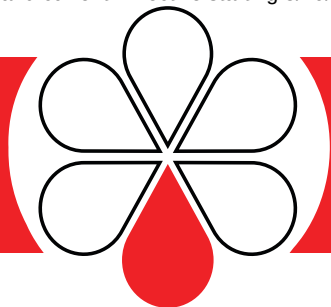




NSAID ADDENDUM

(And Other Medications That Affect Platelets)

RX (PRESCRIPTION) NAMES INCLUDE:

Traditional NSAIDs

- diclofenac – Cambia, Cataflam, Voltaren, Voltaren-XR, Zipsor, Zorvolex
- diclofenac/misoprostol – Arthrotec
- diflunisal – Dolobid
- etodolac – Lodine, Lodine XL
- fenoprofen – Nalfon, Nalfon 200
- flurbiprofen – Ansaid, Ocufen Ophthalmic (eye drops)
- indomethacin – Indocin, Indocin XR
- ketoprofen – Orudis, Orudis KT, Oruvail
- ketoralac – Toradol, Sprix (nasal spray), Acuvail, Acular, Acular LS, Acular PF (eye drops)
- meclofenamate – Ponstel
- meloxicam – Mobic
- mesalamine – Apriso, Asacol, Canasa (suppository), Lialda, Pentasa, Rowasa (enema)
- nabumetone – Relafen
- oxaprozin – Daypro
- piroxicam – Feldene
- sulindac – Clinoril
- tolmetin – Tolectin 600, Tolectin DS

Cox-2 selective NSAIDs

- Celebrex (celecoxib) – Acceptable for platelets.

Other Medications

- Brilinta (ticagrelor) – Inhibits platelet function; wait 7 days from last dose.
- Effient (prasugrel) – Inhibits platelet function; wait 7 days from last dose.
- Plavix (clopidogrel) – Inhibits platelet function; wait 14 days from last dose.
- Ticlid (ticlopidine) – Inhibits platelet function; wait 14 days from last dose.

- ibuprophen
 - Advil, Advil Migraine, Bayer Select, Excedrin IB, Excedrin Tension Headache, Genpril, Haltran, Ibu-Tab, Medipren, Menadol, Midol IB, Midol Teen, Motrin, Nuprin, Nurofen, Pamprin, Rafen, Rufen, Saleto-200, Trendar
- naproxen
 - Aleve, Anaprox, Naprelan, Naprogesic, Naprosyn, Naprox, Nycopren
